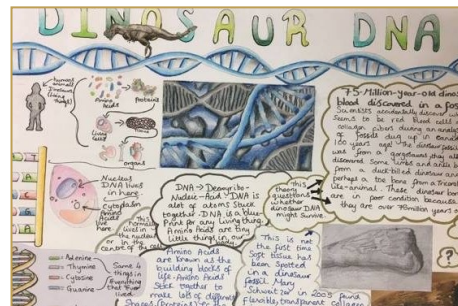
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British Science Week Poster Competition

Visit from the Essex Fire Brigade



On the morning of Tuesday 1 May, Year 3, 4 and 5 children welcomed Roy Evans from the Essex Fire Brigade, who came to talk to everyone about the importance of fire safety. The pupils learnt all about potential fire hazards in their homes and how vital it is to have devices such as smoke alarms fitted.

They discussed the importance of getting out of a fire as quickly as possible and what they can do at home to try and prevent the likelihood of fires and stop them from spreading. Mr Evans also

spoke to the pupils about safety at home when answering the door and making sure they are only letting people in who they know and trust.

A Very Tasty Topic for Year 5

Year 5 are currently in the middle of a very exciting topic, learning all about chocolate! The topic has both a historic and geographical focus, with the children learning about the discovery of chocolate, the

importance of the cocoa bean for trade, where cocoa beans are found and factors that will affect their growth.

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The Duke of Edinburgh's Bronze Award Practice Expedition



On Saturday 12 and Sunday 13 May, the Year 10 DofE participants from Braeside and Normanhurst Schools worked tirelessly over 2 days, learning camp craft, orienteering, first aid and developing team skills.

On the first day participants arrived feeling excited and ready to develop their skills further. After a quick check on how well pupils had packed their bags and re-training on map reading skills, they began putting their knowledge into practice by walking into Epping Forest with their expedition trainer. By the afternoon, the heavy rain started and continued through to the evening. Yet despite the wet conditions, pupils kept their spirits high whilst making their last journey back to the camp site, putting their tents up and cooking and clearing their equipment before bedtime.

The following morning the sun was out and pupils were up early packing their tents away and preparing their route cards before setting off in their groups. This time without their expedition trainer!

All pupils eventually made their way back with a better understanding of what makes a successful expedition in preparation for their qualifying expedition assessment on the 16 and 17 June.

Kandinsky's Concentric Circles



In Art, Year 6 have been exploring the ideas of Wassily Kandinsky who used shapes and colour to express mood. The pupils used how they felt about Mondays and Fridays to produce this bold piece of collaborative work, which certainly helps to add a splash of colour to the classroom.

Year 4 Runaways

In one of their English lessons this month, Year 4 used their acting skills to recreate the story of 'Runaways'. In groups, they successfully recreated the key stages of the story, taking on the role of various Victorian characters. This interactive approach helped everyone to imagine what life would be like for the characters in the story, and to understand how they would interact with each other.



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Year 3's Explosive Lesson



As part of their 'Active Planet' topic, Year 3 had a great time building, painting and then exploding volcanoes! The pupils worked in pairs to build the base using newspaper around a plastic bottle, then painted them to make them look like volcanoes. They then discussed how they could explode them to create 'lava'.



Everyone managed to get some fantastic results using vinegar as the acid and bicarbonate of soda as the alkali to create a chemical reaction. Some washing up liquid and red food colouring helped to make a more realistic eruption!

Royal Schools of Music Exam Success



After focused and dedicated practice, 2 Year 6 pupils did extremely well recently in their Royal Schools of Music Exams. Lauren and Rebecca both passed their Grade 1 exam in violin and piano respectively, with Merit. Aneela, a Year 11 pupil, worked hard to achieved her Grade 5 in singing during her final GCSE year. We look forward to them studying higher grades in due course.

UKMT Intermediate Mathematical Challenge

Pupils from Years 10 and 11 joined schools from across the UK to take part in the UKMT Intermediate Mathematical Challenge. The pupils involved were:

Year 11 - Amna, Isobel, Karishma and Gabriella

This is a national challenge providing an opportunity for pupils to think and solve problems in an accessible, but challenging way. It involved answering 25 multiple-choice questions in an hour and is sat at school under normal exam conditions.

Isobel received 2 certificates which were 'Best in Year' and a Bronze certificate. Heroshika received 3 certificates which included 'Best In School', 'Best in Year' and a Bronze certificate.
