## Braeside Experiments


Children from Years 6 to 11 have been taking part in a number of

Year 10 investigated chemical cells in one of their lessons. They set up their



apparatus and used it to investigate the voltage produced by different metals.

part in a range of space-related activities including a virtual reality experience, a visit to a mobile planetarium and an interactive assembly.


Activities continued into the classroom

The school netball team recently took part in the Local Schools Netball


