Year 3 Visit the Dinosaurs



As part of their 'Footprints from the Past' topic, Year 3 visited the thrilling 'Dinosaurs in the Wild'. It was truly a spectacular adventure with everyone time travelling back 67 million years to the cretaceous dinosaur period. Pupils interacted with dinosaurs, saw a dinosaur being cut open live, watched



an egg hatch and almost got eaten by a T-Rex. Luckily everyone made it out in piece! The pupils had a fantastic time, learnt lots of new facts and were thoroughly immersed and engaged for the entire visit!

Reversible Reactions



Year 10 were back in the Chemistry lab again after exam week. They have been learning about reversible reactions and how you can represent them in a chemical equation. The class looked at some colourful examples of reversible reactions.

It was fascinating to see the colours

change so dramatically during the forward reaction only to then change completely back to the original colour in the reverse reaction. Some really interesting observations were made of ammonium chloride reactions and the



pupils could identify exothermic and endothermic, thermal decomposition, and neutralisation reactions all in the same lesson. Some very impressive Chemistry Year 10!

Junior Duke of Edinburgh Assembly

Year 10 pupils talked to the Juniors in assembly recently about their achievements and hard work with the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme. Pupils talked about how valuable the award is, what they have learned through their experiences volunteering in the community, what new skill they had to undertake and how they have benefitted from physical exercise.

Year 10 showed the Juniors pictures of their expedition route and

what they had to carry on their backs throughout their group walk. The Juniors really enjoyed listening to the Senior pupils share their experiences.

After a walk through the forest the class spent some time in the swing park enjoying a nice cold ice lolly treat!




Moving Up Day

A big well done to everyone who won a prize, but everyone should be very proud of their progress this year!





















Creative Writing in Spanish

Year 9 pupils completed an outstanding piece of creative writing in the course of only two lessons, based on the Spanish poem 'Un hombre sin cabeza' (A man without a head) by Armando Jose Sequera.

Through a series of competitions, they had to complete translation and interpretation tasks from the original poem. They then moved on to vocabulary building exercises which ultimately led them to create two poems in only 20 minutes. They then had to copy their opponent team's poem in a running dictation so they could interpret it through drawing in about 15 minutes.

Year 7 Have Some Fun in Science

Years 7 and 8 have been having some end of term fun in the Science lab this month.

They have been extracting DNA from a kiwi fruit. DNA extraction and isolation is a process of purification of DNA from samples using a combination of physical and chemical methods. first isolation of DNA took place in 1869 by Friedrich Miescher. Currently it is a routine procedure in molecular biology or forensic analyses.

She shared stories of young people with cancer, talked about spotting the signs of cancer and how to support friends who may be affected by the illness. They analysed the muscle tissue and the heart valves as well as looking at and feeling the fat around the arteries. There was a lot of discussion about how the heart works to pump blood both to the body tissues and to the lungs.

The teachers were all impressed with the brilliant behavior of the pupils, they should be very proud.






Rounders Competition
