Pupils are now looking into the mechanism of the reflex arc and how reflex reactions work. Keep up the focused good work Year 10 and try to avoid the distractions!


### **Epping Forest Youth Council Elections**


The Epping Forest Youth Council will be holding an election on Monday 16 March to elect representatives for the next two years. Di

The pupils have enjoyed the luxury of training on astro turf and it has been excellent to see them working hard to learn new skills.






# A Recycled Bottle Top Masterpiece




### **Young Writers Competition**


#### **Year 9 Surrealism**

"It was extremely informative and it helped me have a better understanding of the play which will help me write my essays more in depth." Anoushka - Year 11





#### **Forest School Higher Education and Careers Fair 2020**



This term Year 10 had a serious look at their options for the future at Forest School Higher Education and Careers Fair 2020.

The event was a great success and our Year 10 pupils had a very uplifting experience. As a year group they all had a lively, confident and professional attitude. There were over 90 representatives from industry and higher education, including some of the best universities in the world, high-profile employers such as Barclays, professional institutions and a selection of Gap Year activity companies. All the exhibitors were well-versed in speaking to pupils and were happy to

be quizzed by our positive and proactive pupils.

#### **Year 6 Music**

Year 6 rose to the challenge this half term and learned Chinese, Japanese and Scottish Pentatonic Music, on Glockenspiels, as part of their Pentatonic Scale study in music. This was a very challenging task to master, but all pupils were determined to get it right, attempting it time and time again. They should be very proud of their progress.





### **Year 8 Learn about Respiration Reactions**

Year 8 have been learning about different respiration reactions. They have looked at anaerobic respiration in yeast cells, which is known as fermentation. The class carried out a joint experiment- each team measured the effect of a different glucose concentration on the rate of fermentation in yeast. As a class they found that as the glucose concentration increases, the rate of fermentation also increases.



### **Senior House Cross Country**

Nightingale House was the winner of this years Senior House Cross Country event!

It was a heavily contested race in which every pupil from Year 6 to 11 competed in for their house. Eva, in Year 8, was the winner of the junior section and Jessica Adams comfortably won the senior section. A massive well done must go to Zarah in Year 6 who came second in the junior section and had the third fastest time in the whole of the competition!



All of the pupils should be proud of their efforts and it was great to see them all portraying excellent sportsmanship and helping each other to the finish line!

# **Creating Andy Goldsworthy Inspired Natural Artwork**





Year 3 have been learning about the environmental artist Andy Goldsworthy, and recreated our Braeside School badge using natural resources.

During the lesson pupils discussed what each picture represents and the House it belongs to. Year 3 then went outside and gathered whatever they could find such as leaves, pine cones, grass cuttings and twigs.

They then used these resources to create their chosen image. The pupils
