Reception had lots of fun making bread in class. The pupils did an excellent job of kneading the dough and then really enjoyed eating it for an afternoon snack! Great work Reception.








St John's Church Visit







Year 6 Fish Drawings

Year 9 Art


Year 9 have enjoyed producing these great observational studies of everyday objects. Their next step will be to explore the work of The Surrealist painters who give objects meaning.
