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## Festive Carol Service



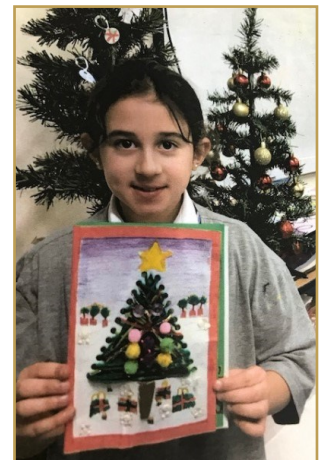

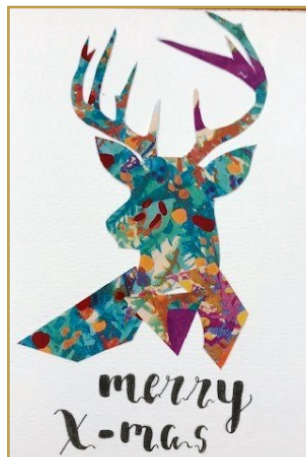




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## Christmas Card Competition

## A 'Movie' Themed Lunch

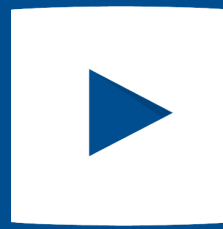
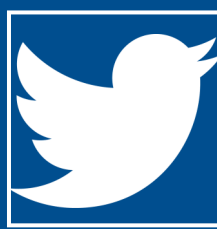

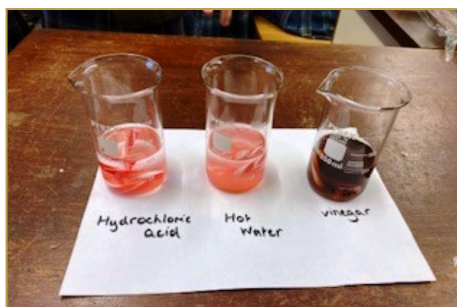

## Year 9 Candy Canes

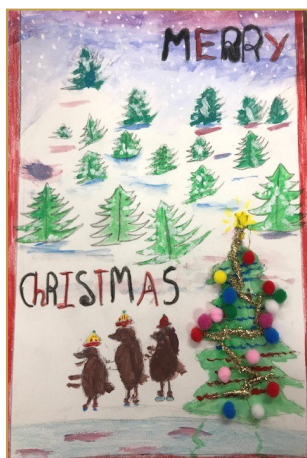

The lesson finished with the opportunity to convert the water balloons into Christmas baubles using yarn and PVA glue. It was as messy as it sounds but Year 8 had lots of fun!
