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
Exciting New Playground Marking!

Learning Performances

Year 9 & 10 were treated to a brilliant workshop on learning styles, revision, motivation, and self belief by Steve Beccles from Learning Performances. Pupils learned things about themselves and the way they should revise. Pupils found it really helpful and are looking forward to using these techniques.



Painting Workshop

Braeside pupils were extremely lucky to have a portrait artist in for the morning.

Paul studied at the Royal Academy Schools. He won the 2003 Jerwood Drawing Prize, Britain's foremost award for drawing, and was shortlisted for the inaugural Threadneedle Prize 2008.

Paul examines today's world of politicians, culture and conflict; photojournalism and film stills to inspire his drawings and paintings. The resulting work is sometimes satirical, sometimes serious but never pure reproduction.

The pupils worked with a range of materials including charcoal and paint. They were encouraged to take risks with the materials and techniques and above all enjoy creating art-work. Once again we were blown away with the results produced by all the pupils as they put 100% into the workshop. Well done on a fantastic morning!

Alma was the first African American to have her art exhibited in The White House, she loved using bright, bold colours in her paintings and would regularly use small, rectangular blocks of colour. She was inspired by science and nature. As a high school teacher for 36 years, she encouraged the children that she worked with to look closely at nature, and to create art which made them happy.

Pupils have been exploring how to mix colour and use paint, pencil and printing techniques to create their own abstract art. They have been really excited to have their own sketch-book and create art using line, shapes and colour.
