This visual experience, from text to stage, gave the pupils an opportunity to observe, reflect and analyse the text they have been taught and provided further support in understanding stage directions, setting and a plethora of other features the pupils will need to refer to in their exams.

It was clear that every pupil benefitted from the event, both academically and leisurely, as the pupils were laughing, gasping and cheering as the plot's dramatic moments revealed themselves – It was joyous to hear and watch such interaction form our pupils. The trip was a great success!
