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UKMT Junior Maths Challenge

Ten senior girls in Years 7 and 8 had the opportunity to participate in the UKMT Junior Maths Challenge.

Year 7 – Amaya, Jaswitha and Eliza

Year 8 - Maya A, Maya V, Susannah, Sienna, Eliza, Riana and Ireland

This event is a sixty-minute, multiple choice competition aimed at the top Mathematics students across the UK. Pupils are stretched to use their mathematical reasoning, precision, logic and fluency in using mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. The competition this year was taken online.

A Gold award will be given to the top 6-7% of the entrants, the Silver award for the top 13-14% of the entrants and the Bronze award will go to the top 21% of the entrants. Follow up rounds, Kangaroo and Olympiads are then offered to the pupils who achieve the very top scores.

Year 6 Bikeability

Year 6 have taken part in two Bikeability sessions to complete their Level 1 and Level 2 courses to enable them to be safer when cycling on the roads. They learnt how to signal correctly, as well as how the highway code applies to cyclists and how they can keep themselves safe when cycling. It was lovely to practice cycling on the roads in Buckhurst Hill and see their confidence improve.





Year 2 Investigate Castles

In Design and Technology, Year 2 have been investigating different types of castles. In small groups, using recycled materials, the children made their own castles. The result looks fantastic!









Duxford IWM

Year 9 travelled to Duxford Imperial War Museum on Wednesday to meet two war veterans from WWII and from The Falklands and Gulf War. Pupils prepared well-thought out and sensitive questions about the conditions of war and the physical and psychological impact of war. The veterans answered questions and told stories from their past. Pupils were very grateful to have had this experience.

Pupils then visited the American Air Museum where we saw a reconditioned B52 Bomber Plane and other Air Force planes. Pupils went into the control rooms to learn about the importance of communication services that were operated by women at Duxford.

The highlight of the trip was the taking off of a real Spitfire plane that was used in the RAF during the war. We also were lucky enough to see the Queen's private jet and board Concorde! Pupils finished the day with an ice cream as they watched the small aircraft prepare for the King's Coronation display.

This was an incredible opportunity for our pupils to showcase their progress in their musical journey. Mr R-S outlined the importance of keeping going and investing time into their instruments, and it is clear to see that our pupils have done just that.
