### Year 2 Plant Investigation

Year have been looking at plants and how they grow. They set up an investigation to see what would happen to a seed if it either had no water, soil or light. They made detailed predictions about what we thought would happen and thought carefully about how to create a fair test. They set our experiment up in our class room and can't wait to record and observe the results.





#### Year 1 Are Buzzy Of Learning With Bee Bots

In Computing, Year 1 have been working together brilliantly to create their first basic algorithm. In this lesson, they explored the school grounds looking for sticks, leaves and twigs so that they could build a den for their Bee-bot. Once they had created a comfortable home they decided on and tested the instructions needed to programme the Bee-bot to allow it to leave its home. It then had to visit a local shop, which they decided would be represented by a large leaf, wait for 5 seconds and then return it home to its den without knocking it over. They had great fun working together as team, exploring and testing their knowledge of directional language, in particular 90oc and left and right, and early programming. It was great to see them learning so much through play!

Years 1-10 enjoyed a brilliant day at LEGOLAND as an end of year reward trip for all their hard work this school year! Pupils laughed, screamed and cheered as they went on rides, watched shows and had fun with their friends.



## **Duke Of Edinburgh**
