






















10 students from Years 7 & 8 took part in this year's Junior Maths Challenge, run by the UK Mathematics Trust.



The students set off from Lambourne End on Saturday morning with their supplies and equipment needed for the duration of the weekend in their backpacks. They cooked their dinner on Trangia's and pitched their tents and then it rained ALL night! They woke up, had breakfast, sorted their stuff out and set off for the second day of the expedition. All of the pupils showed excellent determination and resilience. The Assessor said 'What a great group of kids. They did so well to stay so positive in such awful weather! Tuesday 30 April was a lovely, sunny and mild Spring day - a great day for a Geography fieldwork. Year 9 and Year 10 GCSE students visited the Epping Forest Field Study Centre to do river fieldwork. This will ensure the GCSE group comply with the requirements of the AQA GCSE course, but it will also be a useful Key Stage 3 study opportunity for Year 9 students.

In the morning they were out in the forest observing infiltration rates and gaining knowledge of the geology and rock types in the area. In the afternoon students visited three different sites along Loughton Brook and worked collaboratively in groups taking measurements of the river's width, depth, bed load and measured the velocity using a cork, ruler and stop watch. Year 10 found the day valuable as supplement the rivers component of their GCSE course.













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Year 11 started their Study Leave today ahead of their exams. They had a special assembly in the morning where they collected their Leaver's certificates, heard fond memories and heard advice from their teachers. Year 11 gave the staff their own 'Little Miss and Mr' awards and made a quiz for the senior pupils. They played their lovely Leaver's video (made by Head Girl, Laila) that shared their memories as a class. Pupils from Kindergarten to Year 10 then formed the human arch and cheered them off the site for the last time. Year 11 then enjoyed a tasty brunch (paid for by FOBS) at Molen's in Loughton.
