Year 8 and 9 Social Media Workshop

Mrs Moon organised for a theatre company called 'Arc Theatre' to visit school and work with Year 8 and 9 about safe uses of social media. The company performed a play called 'Broadcast' which outlines the law surrounding communications and mobile phones; safe use of social media and how to report misuse of social media. Pupils found it eye opening and it has given them a better understanding on how to navigate social media and phone use going forward.





Year 10 Science Class



Year 10 worked extremely carefully as they learnt new techniques to investigate the concentration of a solution in a special method called a titration.

This is a laboratory method used to determine the unknown concentration of a solution by reacting it with a solution of known concentration.

It involves gradually adding a solution of known concentration (the titrant) to a solution of unknown concentration (the analyte) until the reaction is complete, often indicated by a color change or other observable endpoint.

Year 10 Exothermic & Endothermic Reactions



Year 10 have enjoyed carrying out the required practical part of their course and have been busy learning about heat changes that occur in a range of chemical reactions.

Exothermic reactions release energy, causing the surroundings to heat up, while endothermic reactions absorb energy, causing the surroundings to cool down.

Well done year 10!

Year 8 headed to Whitehall for a spy mystery challenge. They collected clues from their surroundings and then applied them to Maths problems to solve the mystery.







